Corley receives probation in plea bargain

Former San Manuel resident Wade Jerod Corley entered into a plea agreement with the Pinal County Attorney’s Office concerning his seven felony drug charges. Corley was arrested on April 21, 2015 after citizens of the Oracle

Neighborhood Watch reported suspicious activity at a business complex on American Avenue in Oracle. After obtaining a search warrant, the business was searched and members of the Pinal County Sheriff’s High Density Drug Trafficking Force found 60 mature marijuana plants, several industrial grow lights, over 50 harvested marijuana plants and a high tech hydro system to grow plants.

Corley’s residence in the 900 block of 6th Ave. in San Manuel was also searched. Inside the residence, officers found 121 marijuana plants, several pounds of marijuana and additional marijuana growing equipment. He was booked into the Pinal County Jail for possession of marijuana, possession of marijuana for sale, production of marijuana and possession of drug paraphernalia.

On May 29, 2015 Corley was arraigned on two counts of Marijuana for Sale; two counts of Producing Marijuana; Possession of Narcotic Drug for Sale; Possession of Equipment for Manufacturing Narcotic Drug; and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. In September 2015 a plea agreement was made. Mr. Corley pled guilty to one count of Conspiracy to Produce Marijuana, a Class 3

felony. He was sentenced to 5 years supervised probation, 27 days in jail, a drug fine of \$750 plus surcharges (about \$1,400) and other fines and fees. If he violates probation he faces a prison sentence of 2 to 8.75 years. The other drug charges were dismissed.

According to the Pinal County Attorney’s Office Public Information Officer Tiffany Davila, “Mr. Corley was given probation because of a recent Division 2 Court of Appeals decision. State v. Sisco, published shortly after Mr. Corley was indicted, held that the odor of marijuana in itself is not enough for probable cause because of the Medical Marijuana Act. This opinion in Pinal County, created a strong likelihood that the court would find that the search warrant in Mr. Corley’s case was not valid and, thus, the search was illegal.”

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Property owners who have a widow, widower or disabled exemption need to renew that exemption by March 1

FLORENCE -- Pinal County Assessor Douglas Wolf announced today that property owners who have a widow, widower or disabled exemption need to renew that exemption by March 1st 2016.

The renewal process can be handled through the mail and must be notarized. Any person applying for an exemption for the 1st time must appear in person.

“Under state law, those who have lost a spouse and have limited income can apply for the exemption. Applications must be renewed every 3 years. Those wishing to renew or apply for a new exemption can do so at the Florence Assessor’s office, at the Casa Grande county complex on Cottonwood

road on Tuesdays or Thursdays, or at the Apache Junction county complex on Idaho Road on Mondays or Wednesdays,” said Wolf

“For residents living in the eastern portion of the county, we have scheduled an outreach session in Mammoth in cooperation with Supervisor Pete Rios. We will have representatives at his office at 111 Catalina Avenue, in Mammoth on February 3rd from 9:30 AM -1:00 PM,” added Assessor Wolf.

All applications require a valid Arizona Driver’s License or Arizona ID, Death Certificate, Arizona income tax return for 2015 and the deed and property tax bill. For more information call the Assessor’s office at

In addition, all not for profit organizations must also reapply for tax exempt status by March 1st.

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Oracle Public Library honors volunteers

To honor and thank volunteers for all their hard work and dedication, the Oracle Library held a tasty taco luncheon buffet at the Oracle Inn on Dec. 11, 2015. Dessert was a cake baked and decorated by talented volunteer, Alyssa Vigil.

Those who are new to the community don't realize how many people it takes to keep the doors open and handle all the tasks of a public library. If the library did not have so many volunteers, the number of hours it could be open, and the services it could provide, would be limited. The library is presently open over 50 hours a week, rivaling that of many larger public libraries.

The library building and the property are owned and maintained by the Board of Directors for the community. Fund raisers are held to pay for utilities and maintenance. In the last year an alcove was created inside the building to add more space and electrical outlets for laptop users, and a picnic table area outside. You can use the WiFi there on pleasant days.

The most important service is providing a rounded and up-to-date collection of books, e-books, audiobooks, and

DVDs. The latest from popular authors as well as award winners, fiction and non-fiction, are featured in the New Books section. New movies are available, including the best collection of "Britcom" (British comedies, for those not in the know) outside of England. Computer databases cover topics from genealogy to car repair, current events, and history. Homework help is available to students through the databases.

If you're expecting or sending a fax, and don't want to drive to Tucson, you can do it at the Library. Copies and prints from the computer are available, and you can access our WiFi both in the Library and from your vehicle in the newly resurfaced parking lot.

Some services are free, and some have a nominal charge. What's free? Library cards! WiFi! Computers! Starting

in February, the AARP Tax Aide will help you with your taxes. There is no charge for this wonderful service. And on the Second Tuesday of the month Connie, a registered nurse, will be in the Library to monitor blood pressure for anyone who is interested.

Track your progress as Connie will give you help and ideas to bring your pressure down. Don't forget to check the Community Bulletin Board outside the Library when you are buying and selling as well as for community events.

Anyone with a Pinal County Library Card is welcome at the Oracle Library. Remember, you only need one card to use at any of the Pinal County libraries. The library's current hours are Mondays and Thursday 9 am to 6 pm; Tuesdays and Wednesday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Fridays 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. and Saturdays 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Miners defeat Sabercats, have three-game winning streak

The San Manuel boys' basketball team defeated San Miguel and San Tan Foothills last week and now have won three games in-a-row for the first time this season, dating back to its victory before the holiday break on Dec. 18 against Cibecue. The Miners, ranked No. 25 in the most recent rankings, defeated the Sabercats last Wednesday, 61 – 39. The 22-point victory came after a 55 – 35 win against San Miguel just two days earlier. In Wednesday's game, San Manuel took control early, leading by 10 points at the

end of the first quarter before outscoring the Sabercats 20 – 8 in the second to take a 41 – 19 lead to locker room at halftime. "We came out strong," Miners' head coach Bill Smith said after the game. "We came out and hit our shots right off the bat and that's what got us going right away." Miners' guard Gabe Sierra definitely came out strong, stroking seven three-pointers and finishing with a game-high 29 points. "Gabe has those nights that once he gets started, if he hits his first couple of shots, he's good," he said. "Tonight was one of those nights." The Miners maintained their defensive intensity in second half, holding the Sabercats to only 20 points. It's sometimes difficult to play that well defensively for an entire game, especially when a team has a big lead. But the Miners did just that. "That's one thing about this group of kids I have here," Smith said. "They play strong no matter where they're at, what position they are, or where we are at in the game. They always give great effort until the end." The Miners will take on a one-win Ray team on Wednesday before facing ranked opponents in their next two games, which includes top-ranked San Carlos on Thursday. **Upcoming schedule:** Jan. 13 at Ray, Jan. 15 vs. San Carlos, and Jan. 22 vs. Superior. All games are scheduled for 7 p.m.
