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ATF search warrant leads to drug arrest

In the early morning of Wednesday, March 9, 2016, San Manuel residents near the Rancho San Manuel Mobile Home Park were startled by some loud bangs and voices booming over loud speakers.

The Pinal County Sheriff's Office assisted Special Agents of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (ATF) while they were serving a search warrant at the John Garcia residence in the 400 block of San Carlos, San Manuel. PCSO initially provided traffic control while ATF and Border Patrol Agents searched the residence for weapons.

According to PCSO Public Information Officer Tim Gaffney, during the search, a large amount of drugs and drug paraphernalia were discovered. The Special Agent in charge of the scene requested the deputies take control of the

drugs and charge the occupants at the state level. The deputies agreed and were led to one of the bedrooms where nearly 200 white pills in small plastic bags were found on top of a dresser. There were four types of pills, three of which were identified as prescription drugs.

Additionally, agents and deputies discovered two more small plastic bags inside the dresser with a white powdery substance inside. The deputy field tested it and it tested positive for methamphetamines, according to the report.

Also located during the search was a glass pipe with burnt and white residue inside.

The home's owner, John E. Garcia, 49, was arrested by PCSO and charged with possession of drugs for sale, possession of dangerous drugs, possession of narcotics,

possession of drug paraphernalia and possession of prescription pills. He was later transported to the Pinal County Jail in Florence.

The home's other occupant was not

charged.

It was unknown at press time whether ATF located any weapons or if any federal charges will be filed on Garcia or the other occupant.

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Tragic crash takes Hayden officer's life

Hayden Police Department lost one of their own Saturday afternoon as he was driving into work for his assigned shift.

Officer Michael Haddad, 49, was on his way to work with Hayden Police Department Saturday afternoon, around 3:30 p.m., when he and his motorcycle collided with another vehicle on State Route 177 near Milepost 158, just outside of Superior. Officer Haddad was wearing a safety helmet but succumbed to his injuries at the scene. The occupants in the pickup truck that collided with Haddad were not injured.

State Route 177 was closed while detectives with the Arizona Department of Public Safety Vehicle Crimes Unit (VCU) conducted an investigation of the collision. VCU investigates vehicle related collisions when serious criminal charges could stem from the collision, the dynamics of the collision require a higher level of accident reconstruction expertise, or are officer related and the collision resulted in serious physical injury or death. This collision is still under investigation and no criminal charges are anticipated at this time.

Officer Haddad was a 22-year law enforcement veteran who had retired from Buckeye Police Department and had been working for Hayden Police Department for two years. Officer Haddad is survived by his wife and daughter.

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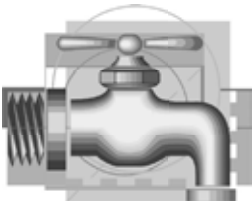

Copper Corridor Economic Development Coalition offers second leadership academy; will partner with Valle del Sol, CAC

For some time, Mila Besich-Lira had heard wonderful feedback about the Hispanic Leadership Institute program offered by Valle del Sol in Phoenix.

Although Besich-Lira, who lives in Superior, was interested in attending the 10-week leadership institute, which helps individuals to develop their leadership skills in order to take a more active role in their community, she said the idea of driving once a week to the Valley or even Coolidge was a deterrent.

Thanks to the launch of the Hispanic Leadership Institute-Copper Corridor in 2015, Besich-Lira and other people who live in the region were able to take part in the program, whose mission is to promote individual development for increased participation in leadership roles at both the local level and beyond. Mila graduated from HLI-Copper Corridor last spring.

"There is a distinct difference between leadership development in urban and rural settings, so it was great to get this program in this area," she said.

Although she enjoyed all aspects of the

program, Besich-Lira said the section on boards and commissions was an outstanding refresher course, and the discussions about the importance of self-care were especially helpful. "Taking enough time for downtime, prioritizing our time and preserving our energy really hit home for me," she said.

David Herrera of Kearny also attended the inaugural HLI-Copper Corridor program. Although he had been politically active for years, Herrera said he had fallen away from politics. Attending the leadership institute inspired him to become more involved in his local community, as well as in Superior, where he owns property.

"HLI was a great way to learn about issues that other people have, and it gave me the chance to meet like-minded people," he said.

Like Besich-Lira, Maria Muñoz of Hayden had heard about Valle del Sol's solid reputation and the benefits of HLI. She too was delighted when the program came to the Copper Corridor.

"One of the reasons it is good to have

HLI here is because we have such limited resources in our side of the county. I found that HLI actually helped to refocus who we are as individuals, and it gave us a better understanding of ourselves and the direction that we want to go," she said, adding that being part of HLI-Copper Corridor helped her in both her personal and professional life.

"A lot of the people who attended were very passionate about helping in their community."

For Mike Montiel, of Superior, attending HLI-Copper Corridor has not only helped inspire him to be more involved in his local community, the program also gave

him the confidence to do so. "It is essential for residents of rural communities to have dialogues with each other; we are sometimes separated by geological features like lakes and mountains, but if we can pool our knowledge we can really make a difference," he said.

"Now I have the confidence to speak about issues intelligently and I have ideas on how to fix them and the confidence to make the changes."

In addition to helping to enhance his leadership skills, Montiel said another major benefit of the course was the close relationships he formed with the other

About 10 years ago five women got together at the "Sonoran Bed & Breakfast" in Oracle to celebrate a birthday. These five women, Sue Parra, Mary Gibson, Valeska Cromer, Elaine Helzer and Gilda Cork were friends. They had

so much fun during the celebration that they decided to meet once a month to support one another and the community. Thus was born the "Oracle Women's Network or O.W.N."

I know it is cliché to say "we've come a long way baby" but we really have. Over a 10-year period, O.W.N. cultivated its leadership; tried out events and successfully supported

the community businesses; formalized the organization by becoming a nonprofit and established an eight member board; supported sports events held in the area; worked tirelessly to provide collaborative opportunities for our local businesses, and established a Tri-Community Visitor's Center with help from the AZ State Office of Tourism and many community members. Oracle's social well-being is important and for the last two years volunteers from O.W.N. have worked two refreshment tables at the Tucson Marathon in December. From this event O.W.N. was able to donate two very large bags

of clothing to Family First and the Behavioral Health facility in Oracle.

"Giving" is not a one-way direction, individuals represented in O.W.N. give donations of food, and art, and volunteer to good causes in the community. For the many people who support O.W.N. we send out a shout of "Thank You"! The future looks bright and we are enthusiastic about O.W.N.'s accomplishments and look forward to future projects. Tourism is the focus for 2016 and helping local businesses to expand their marketing reach. O.W.N. has applied for two grants, 1) to develop a public relations marketing video, and 2) to hold an event for "Public Lands" to emphasize our wonderful outdoor recreation in this area and to provide a workshop for micro-businesses. A strategic planning meeting will be held soon to clarify our next work efforts.
