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Resolution Copper announces key milestone with start of the environmental study process

Superior, AZ - Resolution Copper marks another significant milestone with today’s announcement by the United States Forest Service (USFS) that it has opened a 60-day public scoping period under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) for its proposed copper project located near Superior, AZ (<http://1.usa.gov/1px3Wcg>). “We welcome the opening of the public comment period and the process to evaluate our Mine Plan of Operations and Land Exchange,” said Andrew Taplin, project director, Resolution Copper. “NEPA is entirely consistent with the way in which we develop state-of-the-art projects worldwide and it is an important process that

allows stakeholders to identify potential environmental and cultural concerns so that they can be analyzed and mitigated,” said Taplin. “Our commitment is to people and the environment. Our values mandate that our project be open to public scrutiny and respectful of all views being expressed. As we move from project permitting to a mining operation, our pledge is to continually improve our performance. We know what technology and best-practices can deliver,” concluded Taplin. The USFS is responsible for conducting an independent environmental review of the project. The announcement signals the start of the public engagement process and

it provides information on the mine plan of operations, the land exchange, location and time of public scoping meetings, as well as instructions on how to submit comments to the public record. Input

into the NEPA scoping process will be collected by the USFS and used to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement. “The process requires an open and transparent

interaction between the USFS and stakeholders and in a very real sense, that interaction will shape the future of the project and provide a pathway to move the project forward,” said Vicky Peacey, Sr. manager, permitting, Resolution Copper.

The Mine Plan of Operations and Land Exchange include the construction, operation and reclamation by Resolution Copper of a proposed large-scale mine and the exchange of land between Resolution Copper and the United States.

Resolution Copper is one of the largest undeveloped copper deposits in the world, located in the historic Magma Copper Mine in the Pioneering Mining District. The Resolution copper deposit lies nearly 7,000 feet below the earth’s surface and it is believed to contain than 1.9 billion tons of copper ore. The Resolution Copper project would provide significant economic benefits to the local community and the people of Arizona including new state revenues to schools and local government and thousands of new job opportunities. Based on current estimates, the Resolution Copper Mine is expected to have an economic value of more than \$60 billion over the projected life of the project, through direct and indirect project benefits. The project seeks to create mutually beneficial partnerships in such areas as land stewardship, direct-employment, job training as well as contracting and commercial opportunities for local and Native American-owned businesses.

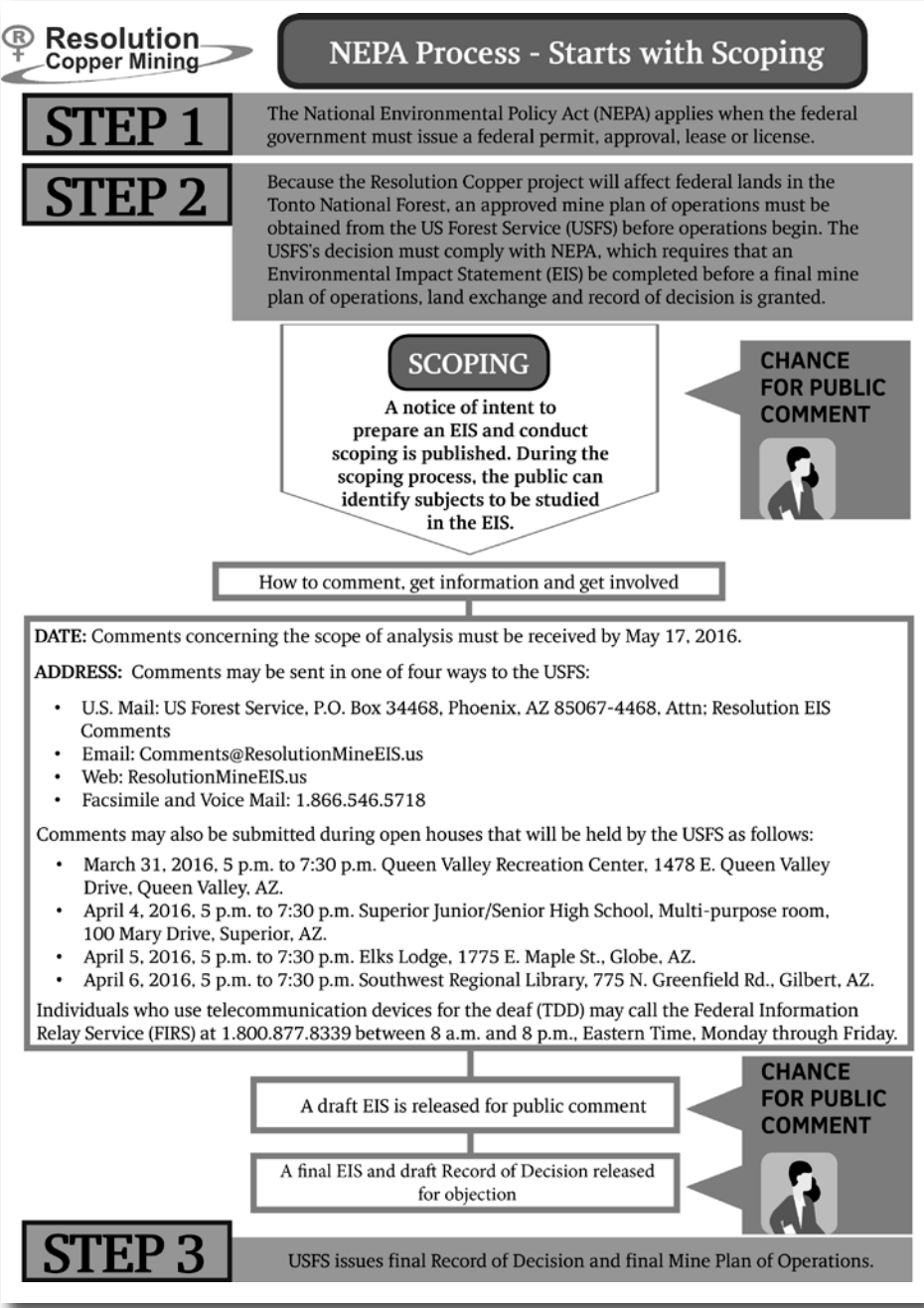

Junior Wayne Newman captured the third Bison’s victory of the day in the 60m hurdles. After setting the school indoor record for the event in the prelim, Newman turned in another blazing time of 7.90 seconds to win in the final, his third title in a row..” “It’s really amazing that Wayne won his third consecutive A-Sun 60m hurdle title,” Head Coach Taylor said. “That is a huge accomplishment. We are looking to establish Wayne as a top hurdler in the nation.”

“Wayne has really found a niche for performing big at meets when we need him,” assistant coach Marcus Evans said. “He broke the A-Sun Championship record and his time ranks in the top 50 of the NCAA right now. He got big points from the 400m and 60m as well.”

In the 400m, Newman finished fourth with a time of 50.27 seconds. In the 4x400m relay, Newman, seniors James Tamburello and Andrew Bosket, and freshman Ryan Speer finished third with a time of 3:25.67.

“Our Men’s 4x400m really surprised with a podium finish,” Coach Evans said. “Wayne, James, Ryan, and Andrew gave their all and we came up just short for the gold. They put each other in great position to win and that’s what we are excited about.”

Wayne attends Lipscomb University in Nashville, Tennessee and is completing his studies in nursing. He is a graduate of San Manuel High School.



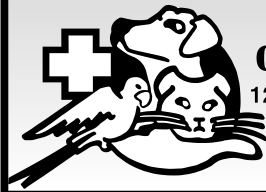

At the State Championship Meet, preliminaries were held each morning. The fastest 16 times in each event advance to the finals. Places 9 through 16 earn a spot in the Consolation finals where they can finish no better than 9th place. The top 8 compete in the Championship Finals.

Mason Stewart earned a spot in the Championship Finals in his 50 Breaststroke, a great preliminary swim got him in the top 8 and an even faster swim in finals landed him a 7th place finish. In the 100 Breaststroke, Mason earned a spot in the Consolation Finals and fished 14th overall.

Ben Fister secured a spot in the Championship Finals in three events, the 50 Fly, 50 Back, and 50 Free. In the 50 Fly, he earned a spot on the podium with a 2nd place finish with a sizzling time of 31.70. In both the 50 Free and 50 Back he finished in 5th place, just a fraction of a second away from making the podium. To round out his experience, Ben swam the 500 Free to a 14th place finish, the 200 Free to a 10th place finish and the 100 Individual Medley (IM) to a an 11th place finish.

Riley Stewart entered the distance freestyle events. At Age Group Championship swimmers do not swim events 400 yards or longer in preliminaries. All long events are only swum once in timed finals. In an awesome 1650 yard Freestyle, Riley went over 30 seconds faster than his previous best time and finished 8th with a time of 19:40.71. Riley also swam

a tremendous 500 Freestyle and 1000 Freestyle finishing 8th and 7th respectively. In the 200 Breaststroke , Riley qualified for the Championship Finals and finished 5th. Riley also had some great swims in the 200 Freestyle (11th place) and 100 Breaststroke (9th place) improving his time by several seconds in each event.

Tabitha Kellam also entered the distance events. She improved her time in the 1650 by nearly 30 seconds to finish 11th with a time of 20:14.72. Tabitha swam a solid 1000 Freestyle to finish 12th. Tabitha is very good in all four strokes and it showed as she competed in all three distances of the IM. In the grueling 400 IM she finished 9th with a time of 5:12.45 (a full 17 seconds faster than she had ever swam before). In the both the 100 and 200 IM she earned a spot in the Championship Finals and swam outstanding races finishing in 5th place in the 100 IM (1:07.99) and in 6th place in the 200 IM (2:27.24). Tabitha also swam the tough 200 yard Breaststroke to a 13th place finish.

Evan Apuron entered all three Butterfly events (50, 100, and 200) along with all three IM distances (100, 200 and 400). Evan finished no worse than 5th in any

event and was always in the hunt for a podium spot. His 400 IM time of 4:51.12 was good enough for a 3rd place finish, the first Sea Lion to make the podium at the meet. Evan finished 4th in the 100 IM (1:01.58) and 2nd in the 200 IM (2:15.61). Evan will tell you that his best event is Butterfly, and he has done well at past State Championship Meets in the Butterfly events. Even with outstanding swims in the 50 and 100 Butterfly (27.25 and 1:00.62) his 4th and 5th place finishes were not what he had in mind. The 200 Butterfly came on the final night of competition and Evan was one of the three swimmers that left the rest of the field behind. In the final 25 yards, when the other swimmers were struggling with fatigue, Evan put on a finishing sprint that was just enough to take the race at the wall. His state champion winning time of 2:13.92 was 5 seconds faster than he swam in prelims and 7 seconds faster than his previous best time.

The Sea Lion 12 and Under Boys 400 Freestyle Relay team of Evan Apuron, Ben Fister, Ethan Kellam, and Riley Stewart finished in 17th place. The 12 and Under 400 Medley Relay team of Riley Stewart, Mason Stewart, Evan Apuron, and Ben

Fister finished in 13th place. For the first time at an Age Group State Championship Meet, the Sea Lions had relays qualify in the top 8 and were able to swim in Finals. The 10 and Under Boys Relay team of Ethan Kellam, Mason Stewart, Ben Fister, and Johnny Smallhouse finished 6th in 200 Medley Relay with a time of 2:32.11 and the same boys on the 200 Freestyle Relay also finished 6th with a time of 2:19.61.

Head Coach Alex Gort was ecstatic about the performance of Sea Lions Swimmers at the meet.

“Having every swimmer earn the opportunity to swim in the State Championship Finals at big meet like this was a great accomplishment for the team and our team score reflected the success,” Gort said. “Ben’s 2nd place finish in the Butterfly was a great moment as he added his name to the list of swimmers from San Manuel with top 3 finishes at State. Evan winning the 200 Butterfly in such a dramatic fashion was truly a special moment.”
