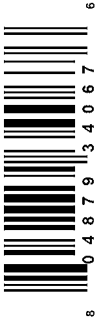

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Pinal County reviews response to measles outbreak

FLORENCE - In January, the Pinal County Public Health Services District (PCPHSD) found itself in the middle of a developing international story.

Four members of a Kearny family following a December trip to Disneyland had contracted the measles virus. None of them had received their MMR vaccination.

“Measles is one of the easiest diseases to spread,” Public Health Director Tom Schryer said. “I consider ourselves fortunate that it didn’t spread to more people that came in contact with that family.”

PCPHSD released a media statement on January 22, alerting the Town of Kearny that a family had contracted the disease. It became a race against the clock for the staff at PCPHSD to investigate every place the family

Mammoth Police Report

According to state law, police may arrest suspected offenders by two methods. visited and to contact every person who might have been near them when they were out in public.

“Data became extremely important,” Assistant Director of Public Health for Operations Kore Redden recalled. “We had to find out those people who had come in contact with this family and determine their vaccination status because measles is easily spread to those who are not vaccinated.”

Because Measles is highly infectious, PCPHSD committed most of their staff to the investigation and response. Director Schryer said “We worked with schools, healthcare providers, the infected family and used the State immunization registry to determine who was at risk based on their contact with the family or lack of vaccination and then did all we could to immunize those who were susceptible.”

One set of employees proved to be extremely invaluable to the investigative process.

School Health Liaisons are placed in many public schools throughout Pinal County. It’s a program that offers health education for students and help with any health-related issue the school sees as a need.

“The School Health Liaisons were one of the keys to helping us out during this outbreak,” Schryer noted. These people are official county employees. They are trusted by school staff, students along with parents and that reaps huge benefits for us as a public health entity. They are our eyes and ears in the communities

Schryer emphasized that this response to the measles outbreak expanded past the scope of public health. Many county departments had a role to play in assisting the department stop this outbreak. Members of the Emergency Management, Finance and Communications were named for their efforts in helping Public Health.

“We don’t have a very large staff,” Schryer explained. “We have a lean and very effective staff and we have a reason for that. Maintaining this lean staff allows us to use grant money to invest in the infrastructure that helps handle outbreaks like this”.

Schryer added the key to keeping everyone focused to the job at hand is clarity and setting priorities.

“All of us have a regular 8 to 5 job and there are duties that have to be completed day in and day out,” Schryer stated. “Public Health leaders have to give clarity to the

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Sheriff Babeu offers to police Mammoth

Pinal County Sheriff Paul Babeu spoke during the call to public at Thursday’s town council meeting. The Sheriff had earlier donated \$2,000 to the Mammoth Softball program. Sheriff Babeu said he had spoken to Mammoth Chief of Police Steve Nash about possibly having the Pinal County Sheriff’s Office provide law enforcement services for the Town of Mammoth.

Babeu spoke briefly about the benefits of having the sheriff’s department take over the policing of the town. He talked about the financial savings for the town which would include administration costs, saving on liability insurance, vehicle maintenance and training. He also said it would be improved service as Pinal County could provide more deputies to the area. They could provide

dispatching service. It would be similar to what was offered to the Town of Superior. There are different options if the Town of Mammoth is interested in a dialogue with the sheriff’s office or want to inquire about a contract or relationship with the town.

Later in the meeting Mayor Jones said that contrary to rumors, they are not disbanding the police department. They may look at options that can be provided by the Pinal County Sheriff. If they open a dialogue with the sheriff’s office it would be placed on the agenda for a public meeting.

In other business, Jeff Hays gave a presentation on available grants and loans from the United States Department of Agriculture. The programs are available for the Town of Mammoth and residents. The grants and loans could be used for building infrastructure, housing and provide for renovations of homes for qualifying low

income seniors.

Lynn Zeiler gave a presentation on economic development for Mammoth. She urged citizens to volunteer for committees to work on improving the town.

Action was taken to approve naming the 5th Street Park to Veteran’s Memorial Park. The park is located above the swimming pool. There may be action taken later to build a memorial for veterans.

Action was taken to appoint an Insurance Review Board. The board would review

retirement and disability issues for town personnel. Appointed to the board were Steve Nash, Don Jones, Bob Sloan, Al Anaya, and Alice Martinez.

Mayor Jones spoke about the financial crisis that the Town of Mammoth is in. The town is looking at increasing the town’s Transaction Privilege Tax (sales tax) rate from 2 percent to 4 percent and possibly establishing a bed tax rate up to 4 percent. On or after June 2 a public hearing and possible action on the new tax rates will be held.

staff to help them understand what is most important at this time, clearly public safety was most important”.

There was an added bit of pressure put on PCPHSD and the Arizona Department of Health Services due to the timing of the outbreak. The Super Bowl was just around the corner and the last thing the most watched championship game in the world needed was to have Measles as the pre-game show.

“This was one of the reasons we stepped up our efforts,” Schryer said. “This game was a year in the planning and every federal agency was in on the planning. They wanted it to go off without a hitch. And in the end, it did.”

Schryer gave his thanks to the public health staff who handled this outbreak while he was out on medical leave. He stated “It is a testament to the strength and talent of our staff that they did a fantastic job when without me, it makes me very proud that we have such a great staff from top to bottom”.

“One of the core reason county government exists are for issues like this,” Schryer concluded. “We keep people alive that could have died or suffered permanent health impacts from this very preventable disease.”

Ore Cart dedication to be held April 25

And then there were four.

First came Mammoth's Ore Cart, "Skeleton Crew Graveyard Shift." It was installed at the Miners Memorial Park on Hwy. 77 in Mammoth.

Many years later the second Ore Cart in the Copper Corridor's Ore Cart Trail was installed in Winkelman at the junction of Hwy. 77 and Hwy. 177. This one, called "A Penny For Your Thoughts," was installed in time for Winkelman's Centennial Celebration.

In January, Oracle's "Sailcart" which celebrates the history of Oracle's name, shared with a clipper ship of the same name, was installed in front of the Post Office.

On Saturday, April 25, Superior will become the next realized point on the Ore Cart Trail map as its Cart, designed by artists Sam Lane and Chuck Davison, is installed at the Caboose Park and Superior History Trail. Everyone is invited to the ribbon cutting and dedication ceremony which will take place at 1 p.m. The ceremony is hosted by the Superior Historical Society/Bob Jones Museum and the Copper Corridor Economic Development Coalition and is sponsored by Resolution Copper Company; Evelyn Cooksley in memory of Bud Cooksley; and an anonymous donor from the Legends of Superior Trail (LOST).
