Doris Geraldine Cartwright, 90, passed away peacefully at her home surrounded by family on March 25, 2020. Born March 8, 1930 in Davis, Oklahoma, she was the third child of four. She was preceded in death by her father Sy Harmon, mother Clara (nee: Harrison) and her three brothers Bill, Ralph and Mitchell Harmon.

When she was age 7, her family moved to Arizona and she spent her childhood years in Valley Farms. One day, shortly before graduating with honors from Florence High School, she met the love of her life, Henry “Hank” Cartwright at the roller skating rink in Coolidge. Falling in love at first sight, they were married in 1950 and spent the next 70 years residing in Pinal County. Most of those years were spent in the copper mining towns of Ray, Superior and Kearny, but when her husband retired they relocated to Apache Junction where she spent the rest of her life. Her husband and daughter still reside there.

Doris was a soft, kind and gentle soul. She never had harsh words or expressed anger to others. To the contrary, she loved everyone she got to know. If a stranger said, “Good morning!” it was not unusual for her to respond with a bright smile, “Thank you! You just made it nicer!” She loved playing games, working puzzles, cooking, sewing, gardening, reading, painting, decorating to name but a few. She could do anything she set her mind to from reupholstering the inside of a car to building a house. Her biggest joy, however, was to be surrounded by friends and family. She showered them with love, affection, laughter and enough food and beverage to serve ten times that many. She loved every minute of it! During lean times, Doris knew how to stretch a dollar. She could make ends meet regardless of the situation and always provided a comfortable

home for her family. She is survived by her husband, Henry; son, Michael (wife Donna); daughter, Marcia; two grandsons, Michael and Steven; and five great-grandchildren, Meghan, Christian, Shannon, Nathan and Karah. Doris will be missed by all. The family would like to offer our heartfelt thanks to all the wonderful people whose thoughts and prayers help us during this difficult time. We are not holding a funeral service. Instead, we plan to hold a celebration of this remarkable woman’s life at a later date.

Do you see birds, bats, bees and butterflies in your backyard? Notice a plant has gotten new leaves or flowers? Watch clouds and stars in the sky? If so, you have what it takes to be a **Citizen Scientist!** Citizen Scientists help professional scientists by observing and recording data for them. What is data? It's information - all the stuff you notice around you - a hummingbird sipping from a flower, how blue the sky is today, the brightness of the stars in our southern Arizona sky. Citizen Science sites collect this data so scientists can use it in their work.

The website **JourneyNorth.org** is a great introduction to being a citizen scientist. You can choose your topic (see word search puzzle) and begin observing and reporting *Signs of Spring* all around you!

Latest Governor Executive Orders: beauty, barber shops closed; playgrounds open; rental eviction prevention

Mayors across the state called on Governor Doug Ducey to refine the essential services list. In the original listing, barber shops, beauty salons, massage clinics and nail salons were allowed to stay open. Parks and golf courses were also allowed to remain open. On Friday, the Governor issued an executive order to close the beauty services listed above and allowed for playgrounds, basketball courts and other park amenities to remain open as long as they allowed for proper social distancing. Golf courses are still allowed to remain open.

Amenities such as playgrounds, basketball courts, picnic areas and restrooms at parks throughout the Copper Area readership will be closed. Swimming pools may also be closed. The Town of Hayden announced that the park will be fully closed on Easter Weekend to ensure that groups do not congregate in those places. The Town of Winkelman has also closed the Winkelman Flats Park for the Easter Weekend. The Town of Kearny has closed their parks and the Town of Superior has closed all playground structures and basketball courts. The open spaces of the parks will remain open and all trails remain open in Superior.

The Boyce Thompson Arboretum remains open but those planning to visit the park should make a reservation to attend. Park administration is limiting the attendance into the park to help maintain physical distancing. Please call the Boyce Thompson Arboretum

at 520-689-2723 or you may also visit their website for more information at www.btarboretum.org.

Arizona State Parks and Trails are open, but all events, group gatherings, and Cave Tours have been cancelled. Park officials are taking the necessary precautions for our visitors and staff as recommended by the CDC and Arizona Department of Health Services.

All park events have been cancelled or postponed through May 8.

Oracle State Park remains committed to providing open spaces, hiking trails, and outdoor destinations for people to safely enjoy in small groups.

Likewise, the Kearny Lake is open for those who would like to get out and enjoy the beautiful spring weather.

On Monday, Governor Ducey also issued another Executive Order which prevented commercial property evictions for 60 days. Congress passed a COVID-19 stimulus bill that will allow small business owners to apply for funding for payrolls and other business costs such as rent and utilities. Businesses needing those funds should contact their local bank.

Deadline for AZ Travel ID delayed one year; Department of Homeland Security sets new date of Oct. 1, 2021

PHOENIX – The U.S. Department of Homeland Security has announced that the deadline for air travelers to get a driver license or ID that complies with the REAL ID Act, including the AZ Travel ID, has been pushed back a full year to Oct. 1, 2021.

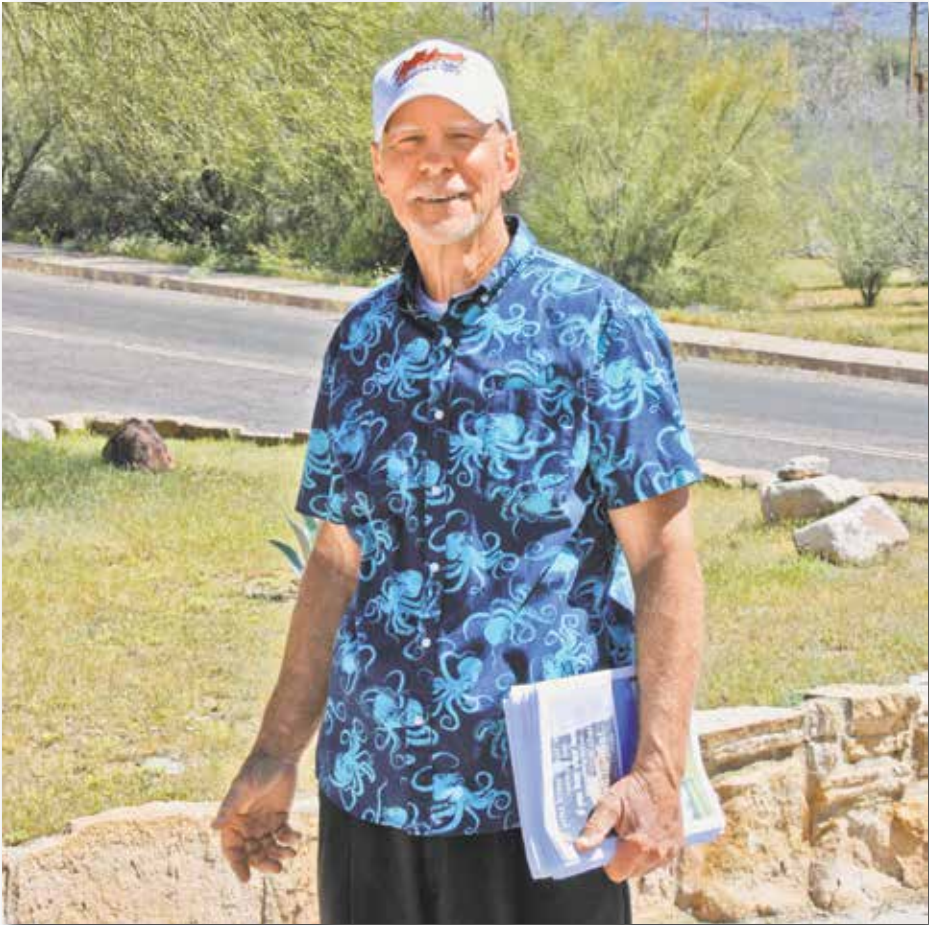
