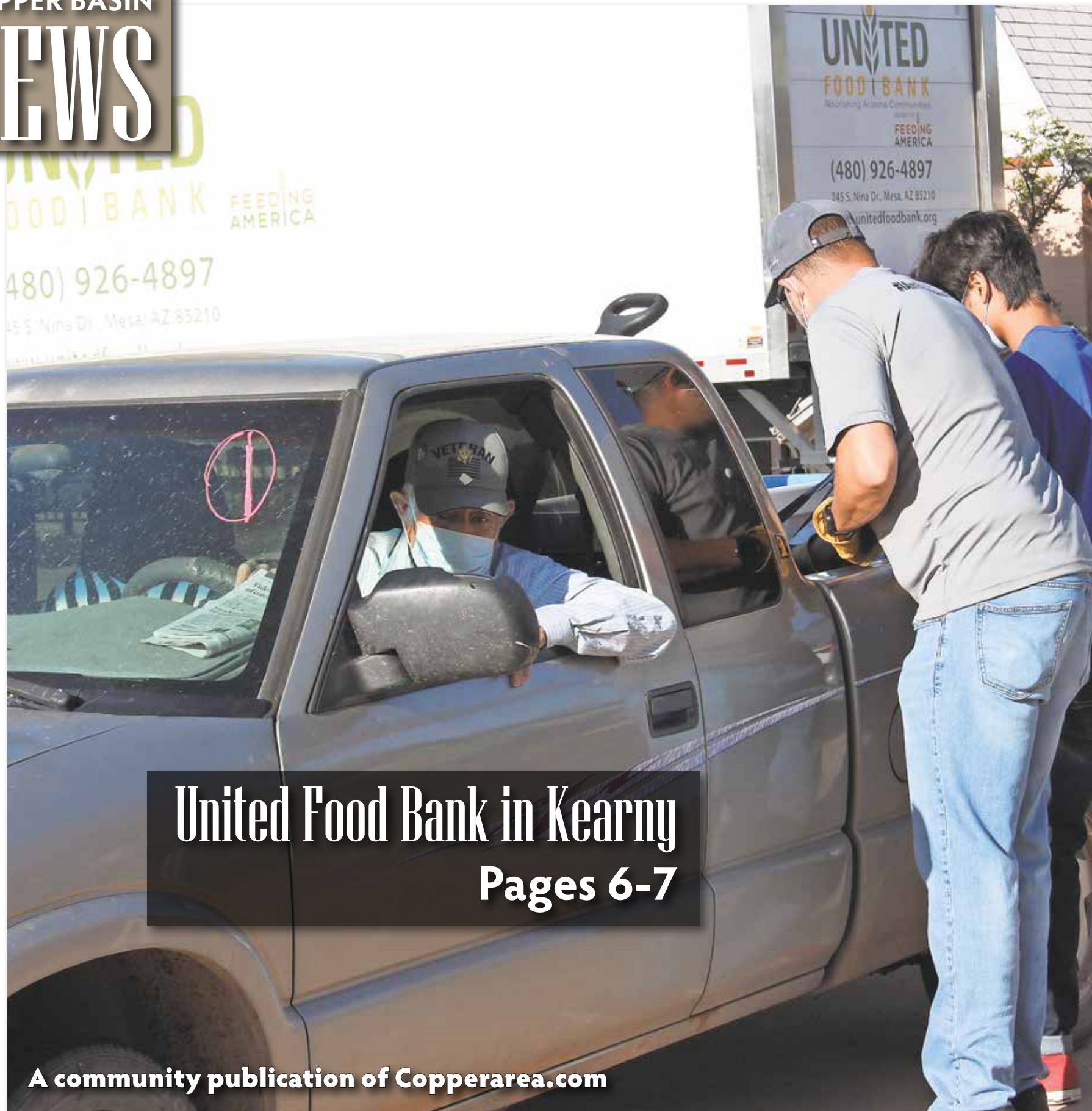


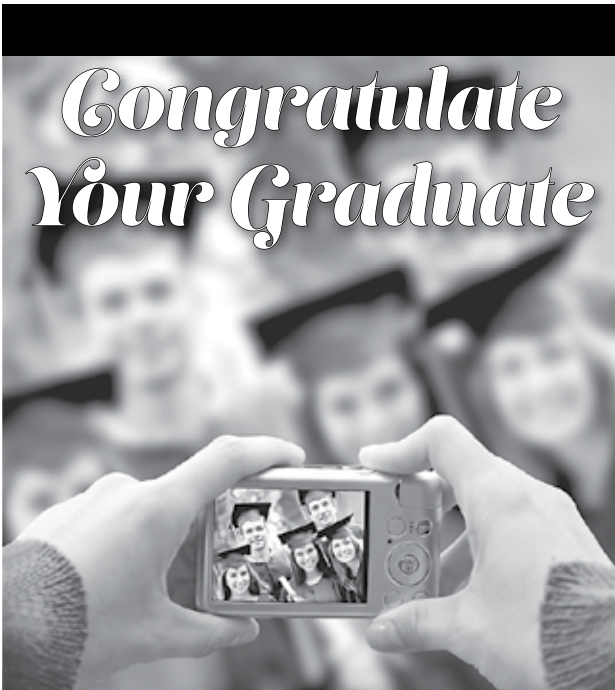

Kearny Mayor Offers Update to Community

First of all, I want to thank all of you for keeping healthy and safe. I would like to update you on the good things happening in Kearny.

The Town of Kearny is working on many economic development projects, some are funded by USDA RD (United States Department of Agriculture-Rural Development) and CDBG (Community Development Block Grant). The Town has received a grant to repair the filtration plant from the Arizona Department of Housing in the amount of \$278,268.

The other projects, the Town is working on are a rehab and modernization of the water system in the amount of \$1.9 million, which is part of a grant from USDA RD, in the amount of \$460,000.

We are working with a water meter company to install new water meters in the next few months. The tentative start date is July 7, 2020. The water meters are part of a grant that was received by the Town by USDA, in the amount of \$310,000. Please thank you for your patience in advance.

The repair of the two water tanks will be going out to bid shortly and the booster system up across the highway will be repaired. This has been needed for many years.

Another water system improvement, is to drill a new well with a grant from the Water Infrastructure Authority of Arizona.

The Town received a grant in the amount of \$69,000 from FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) and Arizona State Forestry to mitigate the salt cedars along the Gila River. We are preparing for this year's fire season and I am thankful this project was completed in December.

The Town was able to re-surface Tilbury Road and part of Upton Road. The Town is anticipating more street improvements in the near future by using their HURF (Highway Users Revenue Fund) funds.

We are working diligently with the ambulance department. This department has received several grants such as the Resolution Corporate Giving Program grant in the amount of \$10,362.06, along with receiving two grants from Apache Sky Casino, in the amount of \$21,950.88 over the last couple of years. The ambulance department has also received funding from Pinal County in the amount of \$14,188.37. ASARCO has funded the ambulance department in the amount of \$18,500, for grant funding and helping to fund the ambulance. Over the next two years, ASARCO has agreed to fund an additional \$20,000 for the ambulance fund.

The Town was able to improve their drinking water system by repairing the four wells that are located up across the highway. This is a permanent solution for the Town's drinking water allotment. The two main wells located within the area of the Globe Equity Decree and

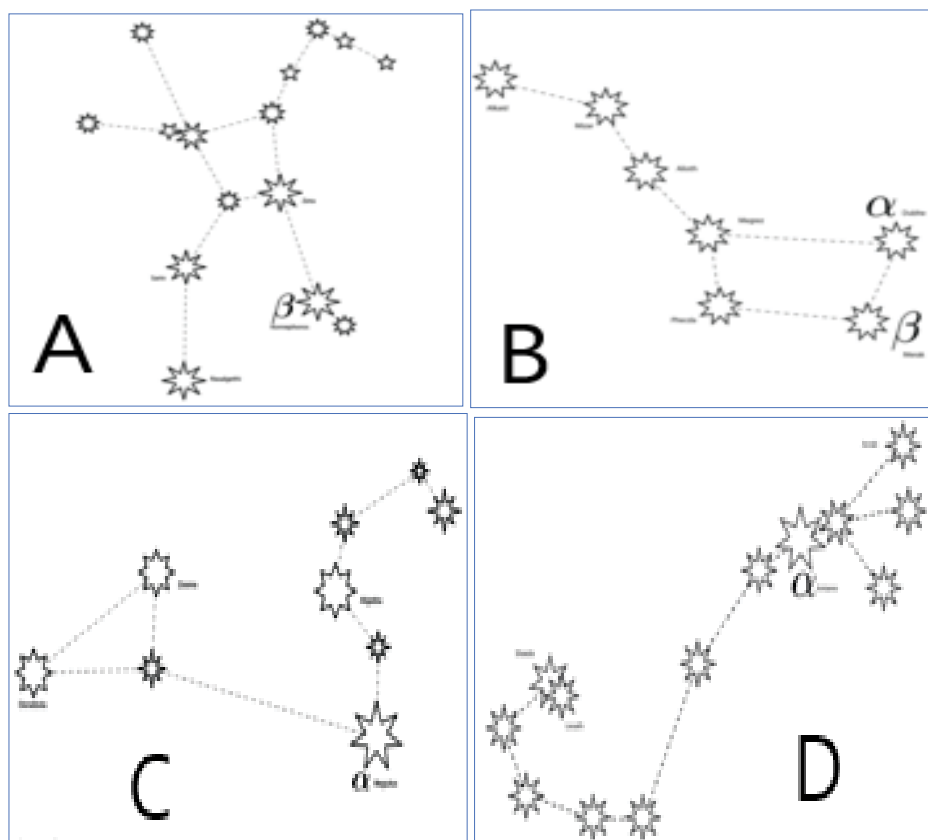

There's **something for everyone, everywhere!** Join a project or event from wherever you are to help scientists answer questions they cannot answer without you.”*

STAR PATTERN MATCH

Match the letter of the illustration to the description of the constellation:

___ **Leo** is imagined as a resting lion. Its brightest star Regulus seems to be the “dot” at the bottom of a backwards question mark that forms the head.

___ **Scorpius** includes the giant red star Antares (the “heart” of the scorpion). The shapes in this constellation remind us of the pincers and tails of the arachnids that are out in warmer months.

___ **Hercules** represents a mythological hero. Unlike the more well-known Orion, which is visible in winter and has several bright distinctive stars, Hercules shows up in the summer. It appears close to Vega, the fifth brightest star in the night sky.

___ **Ursa Major**, or the **Big Dipper**, is easily recognized year-round and its stars are often used to help observers find other stars. For example, one of its stars will lead you to Vega and on to Hercules. Currently, if the Dipper had holes in the bottom, it would be pouring water on LEO's head as it rises.

If you like stargazing, visit **GLOBE at Night.org** to learn about the constellations featured for late spring, early summer observations. Try the matching game (above) for the illustrations here to see what you know about these star patterns.*

Many popular projects involve getting outside and observing plants and animals. **iNaturalist & eBird** are particularly phone friendly – their FREE, mobile apps are easy to use. For families, budburst.org has activities and reporting techniques especially designed for kids.

Are you a weather watcher? **GLOBE** (clouds), **Rainlog.org** or **SkyWarn** might be for you.

Governor announces reopening of some businesses

On Monday, Governor Doug Ducey announced that barber shops, beauty salons and non-essential retail stores may open on Friday, May 8, with increased sanitation protocols and physical distancing requirements in full force. Restaurants can also open their dining rooms on Monday, May 11. Restaurants may only be able to use a portion of their dining capacity and staff will be required to wear face coverings.

Other services such as massage, aesthetics and nail salons were not reopened on this round of opening.

Ducey indicated in his press conference that the Stay at Home order is set to expire on May 15, 2020. During

his press conference he shared data that indicates that hospitals are not seeing an increase in COVID-19 or influenza symptoms.

These openings come with the requirements for physical distancing, increased sanitation and personal hygiene to be in order. Movie theaters are not expected to open until July, in part because the major film producers will not have new releases available until July.

Local businesses in the Copper Corridor will be preparing for their reopenings. In Superior, the local business community and the Town of Superior have signed on to a safety pledge.

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Rios announces farewell re-election bid

Supervisor Pete Rios has announced that he will seek reelection to Pinal County Supervisor District 1 for one final term. The district includes Florence, Superior, Kearny, Dudleyville, Mammoth, Oracle, San Manuel, Cactus Forest, SaddleBrooke Ranch, Eloy, Picacho, Randolph and Coolidge.

Rios has served as a State Senator and is a past Senate President. He has served three terms as Supervisor for District 1 and has both a University Bachelor's and Master's Degree and was an Assistant College Instructor at MCCC. Rios is a permanent resident of Dudleyville with temporary residences in Superior and Apache Junction.

Rios is well known in political circles for his knowledge of government and parliamentary procedure and being results oriented. He takes pride in helping constituents with individual cases as well as implementing policy and programs to improve the quality of life for all Pinal County residents.

He has provided his communities with recycling services; vouchers for debris disposal; chip sealing roads, health clinics and funding for home delivered meals to the elderly and has been the driver of over \$100,000 to Senior

Citizens Centers in Pinal County. He has supported and fought for maintaining college campuses throughout the county and has succeeded in bringing in economic development to different parts of District 1. Many businesses are locating in the valley area of District 1 due to the proximity of interstate freeways and railroad. Rios and the Board have created over 7,000 current and future jobs in Pinal County.

In the mountain area of the district, eco-tourism zip-lines, new mining projects and expansions and Apache Sky Casino are and will be providing new jobs. Inland port; power plants; Union Pacific Yard; landfills; prisons; plastics plants and other projects have come or will locate to the valley part of district.

Eloy and Coolidge will benefit the most from high-paying jobs that Nikola Motors and Lucid Motors is bringing to the valley area of District 1.

"Local jobs are extremely important to Pinal County families," Rios said.

Additionally Rios and the current Board have reduced property taxes for families by over \$22 million dollars over the past few years. The county budget is good and stable and 2020 is expected to also be a good

year, COVID-19 notwithstanding.

Supervisor Rios served as Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Board and served as the county's member to the State's Legislative Policy Committee for seven years, due to his vast legislative experience.

Rios will be opposed by R. Leos from Shed Road in Toltec in Eloy, which is actually in Supervisor Steve Miller's District 3. Leos claims to reside in Picacho, but records in the Pinal County Recorder's Office show that the Picacho residence is not a "Primary Residence" nor has Leos lived there for one year as required by State Law.

People (like Leos) that live in glass houses should not cast stones, Rios said, adding, "This is America though, anyone that meets the lawful requirements is entitled to seek specific public offices. Leos does not meet those lawful requirements."



Give back for National Foster Care Month: six ways you can make a difference for a foster child

The month of May is National Foster Care Month, a time to recognize the critical role that we each can play in transforming the lives of foster youth in our communities. There are currently more than 14,000 children in foster care in Arizona, many of whom are legally free for adoption and awaiting permanent families. Approximately 180 of these children are from Gila County communities.

Thousands of committed foster parents, social workers, advocates, professionals, and volunteers work tirelessly to protect and nurture these vulnerable children and find them a permanent, stable place to call home but there is more the community can do to help.

"When a child in foster care has a Court Appointed Special Advocate voicing their needs, they spend less time in foster care," said Emily Nader, CASA Coordinator. "The child is surrounded by caring adults who are working to provide services to their family, but a CASA is a consistent person who advocates only for the best interest of the child. We work as a team to help

these children heal from the trauma they once endured and reach a permanent and safe closure."

In honor of National Foster Care Month, we encourage the community to learn more about the many ways you can impact the lives of these children. You can make a difference by:

- Becoming a foster or adoptive parent.
- Volunteering as a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) to speak up on behalf of these children in court.
- Serving on the Foster Care Review Board (FCRB) to review the case status of children in your county.
- Helping spread the word in your community by organizing an

event, speaking to a community group, or hosting a training.

- Support the agencies that endeavor to meet the unmet needs of foster children such as Arizona Friends of Foster Children Foundation or Arizona Helping Hands.

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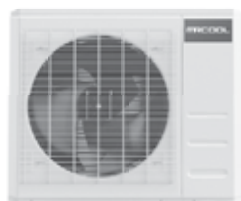

Commercial services are every Wednesday, starting April 15. Please place both garbage and recycling carts out the night prior or by 6 a.m. on your service day. Allow 3 feet between each cart and 10 feet away from cars, mailboxes, landscape or other items that may interfere with service and 2 feet away from the building. Face cart so lid opens toward the street (handles toward building). Do not overfill or place additional garbage on top. Lids must be fully closed. This reduces airborne trash on windy days. 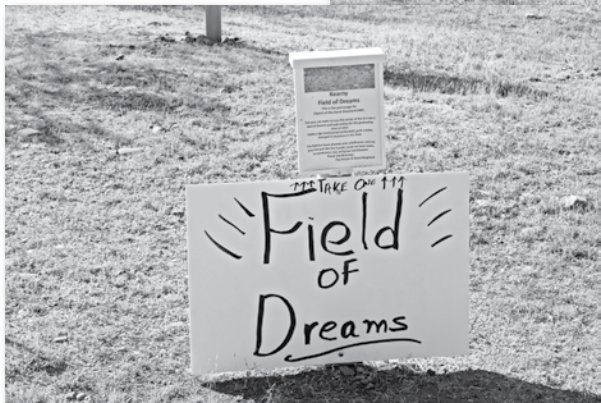

What is Hyperbaric Wound Therapy?

Hyperbaric oxygen therapy involves breathing pure oxygen in a pressurized room or tube. Hyperbaric oxygen therapy is a well-established treatment for decompression sickness, a hazard of scuba diving. Other conditions treated with hyperbaric oxygen therapy include serious infections, bubbles of air in your blood vessels, and wounds that won't heal.



In a hyperbaric oxygen therapy chamber, the air pressure is increased to three times higher than normal air pressure. Under these conditions, your lungs can gather more oxygen than would be possible breathing pure oxygen at normal air pressure.

Your blood carries this oxygen throughout your body. This helps fight bacteria and stimulate the

release of substances called growth factors and stem cells, which promote healing.

Conditions for Treatment

Hyperbaric oxygen therapy is used to treat several medical conditions. And medical institutions use it in different ways. Your doctor may suggest hyperbaric oxygen therapy if you have one of the following conditions:

- Anemia, severe
- Brain abscess
- Bubbles of air in your blood vessels (arterial gas embolism)
- Burn
- Decompression sickness
- Carbon monoxide poisoning
- Crushing injury
- Deafness, sudden
- Gangrene
- Infection of skin or bone that causes tissue death
- Non-healing wounds, such as a diabetic foot ulcer
- Radiation injury
- Vascular wounds
- Skin graft or skin flap at risk of tissue death
- Wounds that won't heal

During Hyperbaric Therapy

Hyperbaric oxygen therapy typically is performed as an outpatient procedure and doesn't require hospitalization. If you're already hospitalized and require hyperbaric oxygen therapy, you'll remain in the hospital for therapy. During hyperbaric oxygen therapy, the air pressure in the room is about two to three times normal air pressure. The increased air pressure will create a temporary feeling of fullness in your ears — similar to what you might feel in an airplane or at a high elevation. You can relieve

that feeling by yawning or swallowing. For most conditions, therapy lasts approximately two hours. Members of our health care team will monitor you and the therapy unit throughout your treatment.

After Hyperbaric Therapy

You may feel somewhat tired or hungry following your treatment. This doesn't limit normal activities.
